



What is Adobe Sign?


Adobe Sign is a cloud-based e-signature service that replacespaper and ink signatures with a fullyautomated electronic version using acomputer or a mobile device.

What is an electronic signature?

An electronic signature, or e-signature, is a legal way to get consent or approval on electronic documents or forms

Electronic signatures are:

- **1 Legal –** Electronic signatures are legally bindingaround the world.
- 2 Tested Adobe Sign has been the highest-rated e-signature app in the Salesforce AppExchange since2006. Many Fortune 500 companies andgovernment agencies, and tens of thousands ofsmall to medium businesses rely on Adobe Sign toprocess tens of millions of agreements every year.
- **3 Secure –** Electronic signatures are more securethan written and fax signatures. In addition, thefinal document is certified with a tamper-evidentseal.
- 4 Auditable The process of gathering electronicsignatures is completely tracked to ensurecompliance. Adobe Sign maintains a detailed audittrail that logs all events and actions taken by youand your adviser, adding a further level of security.
- 5 Verifiable To verify your identity the document issent to your email address for you to sign. As anadded security measure, Fairstone will also sendyou a one-time password via text to guarantee it isyou signing these important documents.





What are the advantages of e-signatures?

Electronic signatures are more secure and quicker to implement than paper-based signatures.

Electronic signatures:

- 1 Apply to the entire document If apaper contract has two or more pagesand the signature is applied only to asingle page, unsigned pages could bechanged without anyone's knowledge. With Adobe Sign, a cryptographic binding is applied to the entiredocument before delivering a PDF of the final, signed document to all parties, creating a certified document with atamper-evident seal. If any information changes on any page, Adobe Acrobatand Acrobat Reader software displaya notification that the document's certification is no longer valid.
- 2 Can be tracked and managedefficiently Electronic signatureprocesses driven by Adobe Signprovide complete visibility into thesignature process, letting you keeptrack of document status in real time,get notified when your documents aresigned, and send reminders as needed.
- **3 Can't be duplicated with a copier orscanner –** It's too easy to forge a papersignature by copying it, scanning it, ortracing it with a pen. With Adobe Sign, asignature is bound to a specific instanceof the document and tracked as part of a multi-step signature process.

- 4 Can't be backdated With papersignatures, signers are free to enterany date or time they choose, makingit possible for one of the parties tochange the "active" date of the signingwithout notifying other parties. WithAdobe Sign, the time is centrallymanaged by the hosted service andbackdating is not allowed.
- 5 Are much easier to authenticate Authenticating a paper signaturerequires another handwritten signaturefrom the same signer for forensiccomparison. If additional signaturesamples aren't available, authenticitycan't be proven. With Adobe Sign,multiple authentication methods canbe applied to guarantee the identity ofpeople signing documents.
- 6 Prevent documents from beingdefaced Paper documents can bedefaced when signers cross out textin the document. Electronic signatureprocesses driven by Adobe Signprotects the integrity of the originaldocument so information cannot behidden or removed.






Where is my data stored in the Adobe Sign EU region?

All Adobe Sign EU1 customer transaction data, documents, and meta data are securely stored in Amazon Simple Storage Service (S3) and Elastic Block Store (EBS) within the European Union in Adobe Sign EU1 datacentres in Frankfurt, Germany and Dublin, Ireland. All Adobe Sign EU2 customer transaction data, documents, and meta data are securely stored in Azure Zone Redundant Storage (ZRS) and Azure Local Redundant Storage (LRS) within the European Union in Adobe Sign EU2 datacentres in Amsterdam, NL.


How do I use Adobe Sign?

Signing using a desktop computer





- 1 Tap the link provided in the e-mail to review and sign your document.
- 2 Your adviser will have discussed two-factor authentication with you prior to opening the document. You can choose to receive a code via text or automated voice call
- **3** Enter the code to gain access to the document





- 4 Find the highlighted data fields that require your attention by clicking the **Start arrow** found at the bottom left of the page or by clicking Next **required** field at the top right of your window.
- 5 You can **draw** your signature using your mouse or by sending yourself a link via text to your **mobile** device to sign using your finger.
- **6** Once you've signed **click apply.**
- 7 Click the click to sign button











Signing using a mobile device



- 1 Tap the link provided in the e-mail to review and sign your document.

- **3** Enter the code to gain access to the document








- 4 Navigate through the fields to be completed by tapping on the **start button** and then by tapping on the arrows
- **5** When you click to **add your signature**, a pop up will appear. From here you can draw your signature using your finger.
- 6 Rotating your mobile device will give you a larger signing area.
- **7** Tap **apply**. You can tap to change your signature at any point up until you choose to tap to sign.
- 8 Once you have completed all required fields, tap finish.
